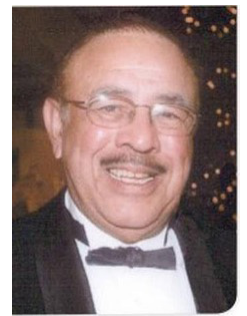
On January 14th and February 11th, from 10 a.m. to 12, we will have our first two Coffee with the Commander sessions. We will have free coffee and donuts and use this opportunity to discuss any issues you may want to talk about, as well as use the time for a bit of revitalization in an effort to get our members renewed for 2023. Memberships and cards will be able to be renewed on-site, and membership cards available immediately on a walk-in basis. With February being Black History Month, I would like to highlight one of our own Post 57 members who passed recently and is now serving in Post Everlasting.

Floyd Brown, the longtime Elgin resident who broke color barriers by being one of the first Blacks

hired by a national radio network and best known for more than 28 years with WGN television and radio, died on December 9th at the age of 92. Floyd served in the U.S. Army from 1953-1955 and was very proud of his service to our country.

Brown was a longtime member of Post 57 and known locally for his roles as a founding member of the Elgin Human Relations Commission, president of the Elgin Housing Commission and marketing director of the Kane County Fair.



Over the course of Brown's 50-plus-years career, he worked as an engineer, program manager, newscaster, sportscaster, and associate news editor and hosted several radio and television shows, including a jazz program, "The Floyd Brown Show" that aired on Sunday nights on WGN radio.

He started out in Texas, where he was born in 1930, and later moved with his family to Washington, D.C., according to his biography on WGN Radio's website. He was studying accounting at Northwestern University in the 1940s when he realized his true calling was radio, the website says.

"He signed up for engineering and announcing classes (at the Radio Institute of America, which he passed daily enroute to his porter job at Chicago's Drake Hotel) in order to pursue his dream and was hired in 1951 as an engineer at radio station WRMN in Elgin.

"When the usual announcer was late one day, Floyd stepped in and made his (on air) debut."

An avid golfer, he applied for membership in the Elgin Country Club during the late 1970s but was initially blackballed. He eventually joined, becoming the first African American member of a private country club in Illinois not associated with a subdivision, his son said.

He achieved national recognition in the mid-1960s when he was hired by NBC-owned WMAQ in Chicago, becoming the first Black to be hired by a major network. It was such an achievement that he was featured on the cover of NBC's company

magazine with Bill Cosby, who was then starring in the NBC television show "I Spy."

He would work at WMAQ radio from 1965 to 1970 before moving to WGN radio and television, where he remained from 1971 until his retirement in 1999. He also had a show on WTTW-TV called "30 Good Minutes" in the 1980s.

Brown's radio show was a fixture for more than two decades, and in addition to jazz, it featured a mix of current events and investment and business news. Over the years, he interviewed an array of jazz icons, including Duke Ellington, Ella Fitzgerald and Lionel Hampton.

He's also remembered as the emcee for the annual Bud Billiken Parade in Chicago and WGN's "Know Your Heritage."

In 2016, he was inducted into the radio station's Walk of Fame in 2016 and was a member of the Fox Valley Arts Hall of Fame.

When Brown hosted his last show on July 4, 1999, the Courier-News wrote, "Brown shattered the color barrier with his trademark dose of gentlemanly grace, fueled by a veiled undercurrent of rage ... armed with a baritone as smooth and rich as molasses."

He is survived by his wife, Betty Brown, who owned a marketing and public relations firm in

Elgin and wrote society columns for North Shore Magazine and The Courier-News. The Elgin Post 57 Honor Guard helped to serve as a last salute to Floyd Brown at his funeral in Bluff City Cemetery.

I hope to see everyone coming out and supporting the Post and our groups at the Fish Fry, Spaghetti Night, Queen of Hearts, Lightning, Bingo, etc... We are blessed with some awesome Veterans, Sons, and Auxiliary family members within our post who give many hours of their time to make these events possible for us all to enjoy.

A couple of upcoming events to look forward to will be the Super Bowl Party and Chili Contest on February 12th, and our Valentines Dance on February 18th. More information to follow on both of these events, so keep an eye on our Facebook page and Post website for updates.

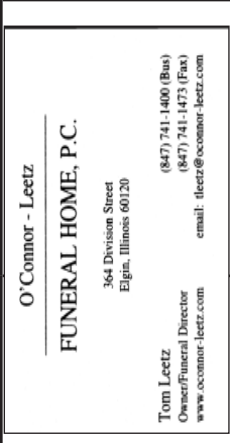

Happy New Year American Legion Post 57 Members!

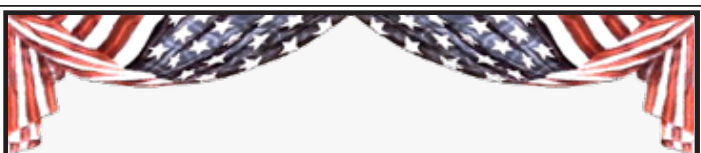
Every now-and-then you have probably received "the" phone call! "This is AMVETS calling, we will have a truck in your area in the next few weeks. Do you have any donations for us?"

Stuff we have in our basements or attics that we no longer want or use can become things of value for sale in resale shops. You know the adage "One man's junk is another man's treasure". How many of us know anything else about the AMVET organization. To begin, AMVETS was established in 1944 by 18 members from nine veterans clubs. These men met in Kansas City, Missouri and formed "The American Veterans of World War II". The purpose was to assist returning WWII Veterans to receive the benefits promised to them by the Federal Government. The U.S. Congress issued their charter through Public Law 216 on July 23, 1947, which President Harry S. Truman signed into law. Since then, the charter has been amended three times allowing new era veterans into membership. Membership is now open to any honorable discharged veteran that has served in the Armed Forces of the United States. In 1946 a Ladies Auxiliary was authorized and a 'Sons' organization was established in 1963. The AMVETS supports the following: AADAA (drug and alcohol program), Americanism, VA Volunteer Services, Boy Scouts of America, Military Funeral Honors, and a Ceremonial Rifle Program, ROTC & JR. ROTC Medals, and White Clover fund raising program. Both Carpentersville and Elgin had AMVETS programs. Carpentersville was unable to continue and merged with Elgin. Then the post in Streamwood closed and its members merged with Elgin. With 25 Charter members the organization received a "Renaming Charter" on June 24, 2015, and became known as the Lee Barrett Memorial Elgin AMVETS Post 202. The Elgin AMVETS now meet at our post home on the first Monday of each month of the year starting at 7:30 PM, except for holidays. The current commander, Jim Cecille, succeeded past Commander Frank DeLoncker, 2007 to 2015. This past Christmas was the 75th Anniversary of the Marine Corps Reserve “Toys for Tots” program. Marine Corps Reserve Major Bill Hendricks was the brainchild behind the program, but his wife was the real inspiration. She asked Bill to deliver a few handmade dolls to an agency that supported children in need. Not finding such an organization his wife told him to start one. That first year in 1947, Major Hendricks and the Marines in his reserve unit in Los Angeles collected and distributed 5000 toys. Walt Disney as a favor to Bill designed the three-car train logo. Not only giving hope and the magic of Christmas to over 281 million less fortunate children, it also provides year-round support to families experiencing challenges and exceptional circumstances. Congratulations to the Toys for Tots organization on 75 years of service.

From the Parliamentarian!

Conducting a Meeting

Members express themselves in a meeting by making motions. A motion is a proposal that the entire membership take action or a stand on an issue.

Individual members can:

- Call to order (Make a Motion)
- Second motions
- Debate motions
- Vote on motions

Types of motions:

- Main motions: The purpose of a main motion is to introduce items to the membership for their consideration. They cannot be made when any other motion is on the floor, and they yield to subsidiary motions.
- Subsidiary motions: Their purpose is to change or affect how a main motion is handled and is voted on before a main motion.

How motions are presented

Obtain the floor

- Wait until the last speaker has finished.
- Rise and address the chairperson (Post Commander) by saying, "Commander."
- Wait until the Commander recognizes you.

Make your motion

- Speak in a clear and concise manner.
- Always state a motion affirmatively. Say, "I move that we..." rather than "I move that we do not..."
- Avoid personalities and stay on your subject.

Wait for someone to second your motion

- Another member will second your motion or the Commander will call for a second.
- If there is no second to your motion, it is lost.

The Commander states your motion

- The Commander will say, "It has been moved and seconded that we ...," thus placing your motion before the membership for consideration and action.
- The membership either debates your motion or may move directly to a vote.

- Once your motion is presented to the membership by the Commander, it becomes "assembly property" and cannot be changed by you without the consent of the members.

Expanding on your motion

- The time for you to speak in favor of your motion is at this point in time, rather than at the time you present it.
- The mover is always allowed to speak first.
- All comments and debate must be directed to the Commander.
- The mover may speak again only after other speakers are finished unless called upon by the Commander.

Putting the question to the membership

- If there is no more discussion, a vote is taken.
- By voice--The chairperson asks those in favor to say "aye," those opposed to say "no." Any member may move for an exact count.

There are two other motions that are commonly used that relate to voting.

- Motion to table--This motion is often used in the attempt to "kill" a motion. The option is always present, however, to "take from the table", for reconsideration by the membership.
- Motion to postpone indefinitely--This is often used as a means of parliamentary strategy and allows opponents of motion to test their strength without an actual vote being taken. Also, debate is once again open on the main motion.

Parliamentary procedure is the best way to get things done at your meetings. It will only work, however, if you use it properly. Remember to:

- Allow motions that are in order.
- Have members obtain the floor properly.
- Speak clearly and concisely.
- Obey the rules of debate.
- Most importantly, BE COURTEOUS.
