This annual celebration of our Post, The American Legion Birthday, and St. Patrick's Day is always so much fun for all.

As Legionnaires prepare for the Washington Conference Feb. 26 – March 1, the nation's largest organization of veterans has assembled its legislative priorities for 2023.

Among them:

- Destigmatizing mental health services, and improving access to those services, to advance the Legion's "Be the One" initiative to reduce and prevent veteran suicide
- Ensuring that VA is effectively resourced to deliver "the best care anywhere" for veterans in a hybrid system that includes tele-health and community services, as well as traditional treatment
- Leveling the playing field for National Guard and Reserve veterans whose GI Bill eligibility is now restricted
- Easing the transition for Afghan allies of the

U.S. Armed Forces who have come to the United States, and helping those who were left behind

- Protecting U.S. Coast Guard personnel from losing pay in the event of government shutdowns
- Changing U.S. Flag Code to permit common patriotic practices at major events and amending the Constitution to return to the states the ability to protect the flag from deliberate desecration

American Legion National Commander Vincent J. "Jim" Troiola will present the Legion's priorities in a joint session of the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs on March 1. That testimony will be streamed live on the committees' websites.

Post 57 is currently looking for high school juniors who would like to attend the American Legion Boys State or Auxiliary Girls State program this summer, and in doing so, they may be eligible for the Samsung American Legion Scholarship.

The Samsung American Legion Scholarship is available for high school juniors who participate in the current session of American Legion Boys State or Auxiliary Girls State and are a direct descendant (or legally adopted child) of a U.S. military veteran who served honorably on active duty during a period of war (April 6, 1917-Nov. 11, 1918; or Dec. 7, 1941, until a date as determined by Congress).

I hope to see everyone coming out and supporting the Post and our groups at the Fish Fry, Spaghetti Night, Queen of Hearts, Burger Night, Lightning, etc... We are blessed with some awesome Veterans within our post who give many hours of their time to make these events possible for us all to enjoy.

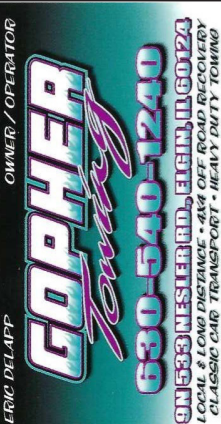
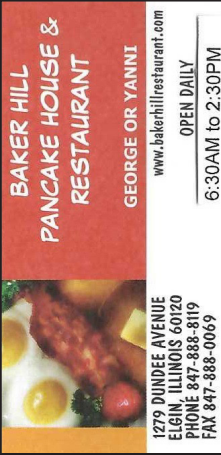

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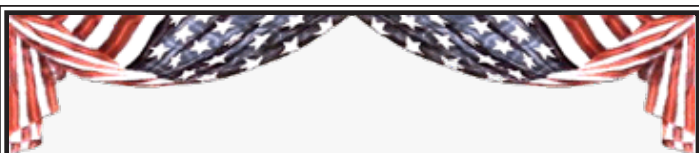

FROM PAST POST MEETING MINUTES

80 Years Ago 1943: Mr. Vern Landis was the post Commander. Sr. Vice-Commander Rohling reported 564 paid-in-full members at the March 9th meeting. By the end of Vern's term, the membership would expand to 651 members, an increase of 24 members, a 3.8% increase over 1942. A Pinochle Tournament report was submitted to the members. Plans were being made for the annual post birthday party. A report was made on the sale of the post bus. The bus was purchased in the 1930's to convey members to and from state conventions, bowling tournaments, and other legion events. Did the bus run its-course and begin to cost too much to operate? Do you know the definition of "seining"? The writer here asks because a report given at the meeting reported there was a plan of "seining" the Fox River and other area waters. 'What!' you ask? "Seining"? Consulting Webster's Dictionary, **Seine**: *a noun*; a net that hangs vertically in the water, having floats at the upper edge and sinkers at the lower. Hence, **Seining** *is a verb, meaning to fish for or catch with a Seine (net); to use a seine in (water).* No other discussion on the subject is mentioned in the minutes, other than the report of the desire to 'seine' the Fox River. A motion from the floor to oppose the action was passed. A search of newspaper records at the Gail Borden Library for further information will have to be conducted. Two weeks later the second monthly meeting was held on March 23rd with 51 members attending the meeting out of a total membership of 586. The telephone bill came to a grand total of \$8.46 (in 2023 dollars that would be \$148.55). The post had donated \$632.00 to the Red Cross and in the past year had donated a grand total of \$ 1,641.00. Interestingly enough the community was experiencing troubles with their youth. At the April 13th meeting, Judge Olney Allen was introduced to the members. The Judge gave a report on Child Delinquency and how their cases are handled in his court. A motion was entertained from the floor to offer the post facilities for high school activities on Friday and Saturday evenings. A probation officer in attendance had mentioned that such facilities were in-need. At the following meeting on April 20th there was mention of a committee that was formed to look into the acquisition of a suitable recreational facility for teenagers. In reading the meeting minutes from past years there are usually numerous reports of member illnesses, operations, hospitalizations, and those that were on the mend in a state-of-recovery. Nowadays, when you enter the post, check the bulletin board in the hallway for those sorts of reports. Acquiring 'Poppy Day'

volunteers has always been problematic. The end of April 1943 was not any different, as Comrade Ventress called for help to sell Poppies. The Boys State chairman was given permission to use his discretion in selecting the boys to be sent to Boys State. 80 Years ago, our country was in a state of war and here are some events from those days.

- In March 1943 the liquidation was completed of 10,000 Jews from Krakow Ghetto
- First war ration point tokens issued by the U.S. Government
- The U.S. and Australian forces sink 12 Japanese Navy ships, 8 transports & 4 destroyers, and shoot down 20 fighter aircraft, during the battle of the Bismarck Sea, in the nation of Papua New Guinea. The Allies lost 2 bombers, 4 fighter aircraft. The allies had devised a new bombing technique, called "skip bombing." A bomb is dropped at low level, and it skips across the water, ensuring a hit. It was much like skipping a stone across water. This tactic proved very effective in the Bismarck Sea battle.
- The War Dept. announced the existence of the first rocket-launcher weapon, the bazooka.
- In April the U.S. discovered and shot down Japan's Admiral Yamaoto aircraft, killing him.
- The Jefferson Memorial is dedicated on Jefferson's 200th birthday.
- On April 12, Martin Bormann was designated as Hitler's second-in-command.
- The Glenn Miller Orchestra provided the most popular music of the time.

Current Event: In a January 2023 VFW Magazine article, written by Jane Dyhouse an announcement that a project to put a face with every name on the Vietnam Memorial Wall, started in August of 2001, and further enhanced by a more organized effort in 2009, the Vietnam Memorial Fund (VVMF) had been completed. Written remembrances submitted by family and friends have been added, too. There is a place for you to add your written remembrance. Visit www.vvmf.org/wall-of-faces"
