FROM THE POST ADJUTANT'S OFFICE

Hello, fellow veterans,

I would like to make eligible veterans aware of something that I was recently approached with that is extremely important. Many veterans do not know that there is community emergency treatment reporting and care coordination available to them. However, they must complete an enrollment application for health benefits on VA Form 10-10EZ. This must be filled out to determine individual eligibility for VA medical benefits. Veterans need to be aware of the following information:

The 10-10EZ is a very detailed form, but it is well worth the time and effort. If assistance is needed to fill out this form, the applicant can contact the VA at 1-877-222-8387, or the VA enrollment coordinator. Once it is determined whether a veteran can be enrolled, they are then entered into the VA health care system, unless the veteran is 100 percent VA disabled. It is imperative, however, that veterans are aware of these points:

If a veteran does not use the VA health care system for two years, they are automatically dropped out of the system and are no longer eligible for VA emergency care. This, however, does not apply to non-emergencies. Visits to a community emergency room must be reported to the VA emergency care, no matter where one might be, ASAP.

The emergency providers should report your treatment by calling 1-844-724-7842.

The veteran's emergency visit must be reported within 72 hours of the arrival at the hospital or there is a chance the cost of the hospital visit could fall back on the veteran. I hope this will be of use to anyone who is in need of assistance.

Please keep these details in mind. As always, from me to you; Semper Fidelis, always faithful.

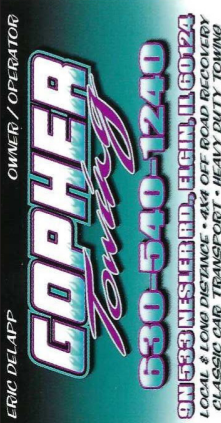
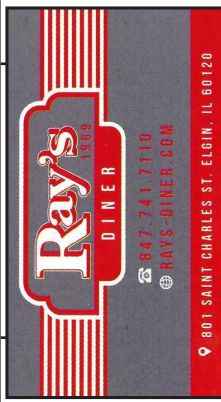

FROM PAST POST MEETING MINUTES

85 Years Ago, in November and December

11.8.1938 Reported 252 members' dues paid for 1939. American Legion posters have been placed on display on five billboards in the city of Elgin. The post will participate in Armistice Day (Veterans Day) activities at Maroon Field. Volunteers are needed to speak to students at schools.

11.22.38 Reported 337 members' dues paid for 1939. The post will have a turkey raffle at the next meeting. Announced a committee of two formed for the purchase of new colors for the post. Election of officers for the Kane County Veterans Commission announced. Leftover Armistice Day dinner/dance flowers and cards sent to hospitalized legion members.

Executive Meeting The group discussed the need to replace the sink in the canteen, purchase of coal, and donation for a skating event. A motion to hold a New Year's Eve party was passed.

12.13.38 Sr. Vice-Commander McKinnon announced 350 members' dues paid for 1939. Jr. Vice-Commander Rakow announced tickets for the recent Armistice Day Dinner/Dance now accounted for, leaving a \$77.00 deficit. Comrade Leech announced there would be a Turkey Raffle in the canteen at the next meeting. Motion made by Comrade Norlander to hold a "grab-bag" at the next meeting and to send a letter to all of the members announcing the event. Comrade Stolt then made a motion to invite "Tom and Jerry" to the next meeting. (Anyone knows of a good recipe, see me if you need one) Four new members introduced to the meeting attendees. Commander announced the appointment of Comrade Nelson as chairperson of the Disaster Relief Committee. Considerable discussion on the formation of a Blood Donor Club. A letter sent to advise Dr. Hemming that post members will donate blood anytime transfusions are needed. Comrade Huber motioned to donate \$100.00 to the Elgin Recreation Council to assist in financing a winter program. Comrade Norlander made a motion to donate \$15.00 to the Elgin Skating Association. Finance officer reported the post funds balances: General \$304.90 (\$6,942.00 today) Canteen \$575.93 (\$13,113.00 today) A letter of gratitude and thanks sent to the Ladies Auxiliary for the new curtains. Members approved a \$5.00 donation to the Elgin Shoe Fund.

12.27.38 At this last meeting of the year, the Sr. Vice-Commander presided in the absence of the commander. A report was given on the Children's Christmas Party. Jr. Vice-Commander relayed information on the New Year's Eve Party. A motion was made to send a resolution of support for the Dies Commission of Un-American activities.

(On May 26, 1938, Texas Congressman Martin Dies, Jr. organized the U.S. House of Representatives Commission for the investigation of Un-American Activities. At first formed to investigate fascist activities, the committee "quickly became a controversial vehicle to persecute individuals and groups for their alleged communist ties". A precursor to the Red Scare and McCarthyism and only ended when U.S. Army lawyer Joseph Welch asked Joseph R. McCarthy, "Have you no decency?")

In last month's Post Scripts, a promise to present the story of a disaster so catastrophic that it transformed how natural gas leaks are detected. The story takes place in the town of New London, Texas. Located in oil-boom east Texas, the wealth from the surrounding oil fields afforded New London to build a new, modern million dollar school. However, it was the era of the Depression, and to save \$300 per month (\$6,531.00 in 2023 dollars), the Rusk County superintendent and school district board canceled the natural gas provider's contract. They then ordered the construction of a pipeline from a 'residue-gas' supply be built and installed at the school. Residual gas accompanies the oil crude when it is extracted, this gas is considered a waste product by the oil companies and is "flared-off". "The practice- (of siphoning off gas)-while not explicitly authorized by local oil companies-was (a) widespread (practice) in the area". Free natural gas! Unbeknownst to the school principal and teachers, the pipeline connection leaked, and odorless gas was 'pooling' in the basement. There were clues to the problem. For weeks, numerous students complained of headaches. Nobody expected the pipeline and the leaking gas to be the culprit. At 3:17 PM, on March 18, 1937, a shop teacher in the school basement had just finished repairing a hand sander. He plugged it in and turned it on. It is not known for sure, but it was suspected that the motor provided the spark that ignited the gas. The blast lifted the roof, which fell, along with the collapsing walls and killed 68-5th graders, 87-6th graders, 34-7th graders, 31-8th graders, 11-9th graders, 16-10th graders, 23-11th graders, 16-Teachers, and 8-additional people, 294 in all. The event is the worst school disaster in Texan history. Following the disaster, the Texas legislature enacted laws requiring the inclusion of an odorant in natural gas. Today the rotten-egg smelling substance injected into natural gas, provides an alert that there is a danger looming with potential disaster.

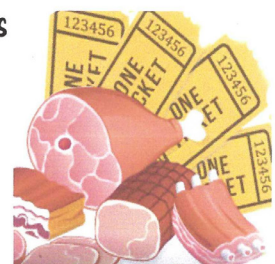
